



Using Films On Demand

Daytona Beach Campus Online Instructions

IMPORTANT: PRINT THESE INSTRUCTIONS NOW FOR USE WHILE SEARCHING.

Films On Demand provides instant access to a growing collection of streaming video titles suitable for both undergraduate and graduate level courses. Videos are available on-demand, 24 hours day – no order forms, no wait times, and no shipping fees.

The following instructions will tell you how to:

- A. Access Films On Demand
- B. Conduct a Search
- C. Browse Collection
- D. View Titles

A. Access Films On Demand

- ◆ Go to the **Hunt Library home page** (<http://library.erau.edu>).
- ◆ Click on **Daytona Beach Campus**.
- ◆ Click on **Find Articles (Databases)**.
- ◆ Click on **Using the Databases**.
- ◆ After reading the instructions, click on **ERNIE** (<http://ernie.erau.edu>).
- ◆ Login to **ERNIE** with your username and password.
- ◆ Scroll down to find the **Admin Services** module. (If you don't see this module, click on your browser's refresh or reload icon and it will usually appear.)
- ◆ Click on **Library Databases** which will take you to the **Databases** access page. (You will remain signed into this page until you close your browser. This feature allows you to search additional web databases without signing in again.)
- ◆ Locate **Films On Demand** from the alphabetical list and click on **Films On Demand**.

IMPORTANT: If this database requires another Username and Password for login, you may need to temporarily disable any firewall installed on your computer. Firewalls often interfere with the login process.

B. Conduct a Search

- ◆ Enter your search term(s) in the box next to **Embry-Riddle**.
- ◆ **Search Tips:**
 - Use **and** between words to ensure that each term is present somewhere in the search results: *labor and airlines*.
- ◆ Click on the **red arrow** or hit the Enter key to start your search.

C. Browse Collection

- ◆ Under the **All Videos** tab you can browse the Hunt Library's collection of **Films On Demand** titles by one of two ways - alphabetically or by subject.
- ◆ To browse the collection alphabetically, enter a page number in the **Go to page** box and then click on the red arrow located at both the top and bottom of the title list.
- ◆ To browse the collection by subject, choose one of the subject folders on the left hand side of the page to see a list of titles.

D. View Titles

- ◆ Click on the Play Video button or on the title you want to view, then click on the play button in either your **Windows Media Player**, **QuickTime Player**, or **Adobe Flash Player**.
- ◆ By default, titles are to play in their entirety but can also be played by segment.

Note: In order to use **Films On Demand** you will need a current version of **Windows Media Player**, **QuickTime Player**, or **Adobe Flash Player**. These players can be downloaded for free. Simply click on the links below and follow the instructions to install the product.

Start at <http://microsoft.com> > click Downloads and Trials from right-hand menu > click Windows Media Player Downloads in center of screen > choose the appropriate Windows Media player.

Start at <http://www.apple.com> > click Downloads from top menu > click QuickTime from center of screen > download appropriate player.

[Adobe Flash Player](#) – links for MAC and PCs

Start at <http://www.adobe.com> > click Downloads from top menu > click Get Flash Player > download appropriate player.

Important: **Films On Demand** can only be viewed using Internet Explorer, and is not currently supported by any other web browser.
