The Barr Memorial Library has a variety of services and materials and should be useful for your research efforts. The library contains approximately 84,000 books in addition to its periodical and microform collections. Basic services and policies of the library are outlined below.

Borrowing Privileges

Active duty and retired military personnel and their families, as well as civilians employed on post, may use the library and borrow materials. A library card may be obtained by presenting a valid ID card at the circulation desk.

Periodicals/Microforms

The library receives over 315 periodical subscriptions. Back issues of some of these are kept on microfiche. Microfiche reader/printers are available for public use.

Database Search Services

When looking for periodical articles or report literature, patrons may be able to perform searches using the library's CD-ROM indexes. Some databases useful to your research are listed in the "Research Sources" section of this guide. To learn whether these sources are available, contact a reference librarian. There is no charge for this service.

Interlibrary Loan Service

Interlibrary loan services are available for requesting articles and documents that are not in the library. Requests for these items may be filled out at the reference desk. There may be a charge for this service

The Louisville Free Public Library contains approximately 1 million books in addition to its periodical and microform collections. Basic services and policies of the library are outlined below.

Borrowing Privileges

Library cards are free to residents of Jefferson County. Military personnel and their families are considered residents. You can obtain a card by presenting a photo ID and proof of residence at the circulation desk. Non-residents may obtain a library card for an annual fee of \$25.

Periodicals/Microforms

The library receives over 2,300 periodical subscriptions. Back issues of some of these are available on microfiche or microfilm. Microform reader/printers are available for public use.

Database Search Services

When looking for periodical articles or report literature, patrons may be able to perform searches using the library's CD-ROM or online indexes. Some databases useful to your research are listed in the "Research Sources" section of this guide. To learn whether these sources are available, contact a reference librarian. The University of Louisville Libraries house approximately 746,000 books in addition to their periodical, microform, and government documents collections. The libraries' materials are accessible using the online catalog, Minerva 2000. The library facilities are open to the public, but a library card is required to check out materials. Services and policies of the libraries are outlined below.

Borrowing Privileges

Area residents can obtain a borrower's card by presenting a photo ID and proof of residence at the circulation desk. There is no charge for the card.

Periodicals/Microforms

The libraries receive over 4,700 periodical subscriptions and have more than 1.6 million microform items. Microform reader/printers are available for public use.

Database Search Services

Some databases useful to your research are listed in the "Research Sources" section of this guide. To learn whether these sources are available, contact a reference librarian.
